Another reason for the groupings in the new building was that the sections located there have the greatest need for inter-departmental contact, Koester said.

The building's interior pleasant and well-lighted, but far from elegant, which is precisely what the city had in mind. Its spartan aspects derive from the city council's efforts to put up as much adequate building as possible for the least amount of money, Koester said.

Almost all the structure's 15,-000 square feet of floor space is fully usable, for instance, because all halls and stairways are outside Offices and other closed Water and finance also make areas are carpeted, but open spaces are laid with vinvl tile. The building has piped in music. but the city will provide its own tapes and operate the system.
