

Slaying Victim's Effects Found

Sheriff's detectives Tuesday discovered personal effects and papers belonging to two of the young women allegedly killed by Edmund Emil Kemper.

According to a spokesman, Kemper told authorities the location of the papers, which were on a rocky cliff south of Carmel near the area where the limbs of Cynthia Schall were found last January.

Santa Cruz authorities, who were aided by Monterey County sheriff's deputies, declined to say to whom the personal effects belonged.

Kemper is currently being held without bail in the Santa Cruz County jail.
