SC Still Lags In Cabrillo Music Festival Fund Drive

The fund campaign that helps to finance the annual Cabrillo Music festival is about \$2000 short of its goal - and most of that is due from the Santa Cruz area, as expected.

Festival ent Hart told the Cabrillo board of zo Valley areas have firmly trustees yesterday that more than \$10,000 has been raised in donations toward the 12.500acgoal.

In the past the festival has had difficulty in obtaining financial aid from the Santa Cruz area, although the Watsonville, Director Richard the mid-county and San Lorenbacked the program.

However the festival fund campaign still is "ahead of last vear." reported Hart.

He said the remaining \$12,500 of the total \$25,000-budget will be raised in festival ticket sales and program advertisements.

Thirteen thousand brochures promoting the festival have been mailed, said Hart, and another 7000 will be distributed in the future.

He said Sunset magazine plans to publish a feature about the festival in its July or August edition and that the PG&E

Progress pamphlet, which is tos, or by telephoning 475-6000. sent to all PG&E customers in northern California, will feature the festival in July. He added the county advertising committee has given financial assistance to the event and he hopes the local chambers of commerce will contribute

The Cabrillo Music festival is scheduled for two summer weekends - August 20 through 22 and August 27 through 29. Season tickets for both weekends are \$14, \$21 or \$28. For the first weekend, they are \$8, \$12 or \$16 and for the second weekend, \$6, \$9 or \$12. Single concert tickets are \$1.50, \$2.50 or \$3.50 for afternoon performances and \$2, \$3 or \$4 in the evening.
