Capitola Also To Polls

SV To Decide On Cityhood

Voters go to the polls in Scotts Valley tomorrow in the climax of a month-long campaign to incorporate the area. Down-county, in already-incorporated Capitola, voters will choose two councilmen, a clerk and a city treasurer.

Scotts Valley polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. at the Scotts Valley school, the new fire house, and the Scotts Valley Baptist church.

Capitola polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the city hall.

Backers of incorporation for Scotts Valley say it will provide local control and protect the area from annexation by Santa Cruz. Opponents say it would increase taxes for Scotts Valley residents.

Only one contest is scheduled in Capitola's election. Three men are running for the two council posts, while incumbent Clerk Ray Abicht and Treasurer Lee Craig are unopposed. Council candi-

dates are Mayor Andrew Antonetti, and Joseph Morrison and James Sullivan. Incumbent Councilman John Hesketh is not seeking re-election.

In Scotts Valley, seven men are running for the five-man city council, which will be chosen if incorporation wins. The seven are James D. Alford, Bill Graham, M. Willis Lotts, W. B. Peard, Charles Rickard, C. R. Roberson and Ken Stacy.

Approximately 3.5 square miles of Scotts Valley are included in the proposed incorporation boundaries. About 800 persons will be eligible to vote, it is believed.
