

# Health Department Building To Be Dedicated During Fair

Four days next week citizens of Santa Cruz county not only will have a chance to become acquainted with the handsome new county health department building but also to gain a greater insight into 22 of the various groups and agencies which do so much to provide a healthier county, a better one in which to live.

Beginning Wednesday, the day of the official dedication of the building, exhibits will be open and a number of films will be shown. The latter will include "The Open City," American Cancer society; "A Day at Camp Campbell," Crippled Children's society; "Meeting the Need for Adolescents," Santa Cruz County Youth committee; "Are You Positive?" Santa Cruz County Tuberculosis and Health association; "V for Volunteers," Santa Cruz Community council; "So Much for So Little," county health department; "You're the Doctor," Santa Cruz County Medical society auxiliary; "A Family Affair," Family Serv-

ice Agency auxiliary; "What Is Cerebral Palsy?" United Cerebral Palsy Tri-County affiliate, and colored slides of the Forest Lakes lodge maintained by Santa Cruz Chapter and auxiliary of Disabled American Veterans.

Coffee and doughnuts will be sold during the Health Fair, by members of the newly-organized County Hospital auxiliary, which plans to use the proceeds to purchase a cart to carry books, gift items and useful sundries to patients at the hospital.

Besides setting up a display, the Senior Citizens Opportunities group will provide musical entertainment and dancing. Wednesday from 3 to 3:30 p.m., the SCO string orchestra will play a number of selections; Thursday, at the same hours, a 50-voice SCO chorus will offer a program, and Friday, again at the same time, the SCO Wagon Wheel dancers will present a folk dance exhibition.

Along with its exhibit, the Santa Cruz Handcraft Class for the Blind, sponsored by the Santa Cruz Lions club, will be selling products made during the twice-monthly meetings. There will be poodle dogs of yarn, a number of crocheted and knit articles, belts and coin purses of leather, stuffed toys, shoe buffers, basketweave work, Hawaiian paper leis and fiber flowers.

How they aid by way of prayer, dinners and entertainment at Palo Alto Veterans Administration hospital will be shown by the DAV chapter and auxiliary in Room 23.

"Pinky the Puppet" will be one of the features at the exhibit of Santa Cruz Sisters hospital's auxiliary. Pinky is the little doll which auxiliary members make and which will be given to the children upon admission to the hospital so the little ones may have a "hospital" friend. Pinky goes home with the convalescents, too. In addition, the auxiliary will be showing the attractive tray decorations it makes for patients unfortunate enough not to be home during the holidays during the year.

Besides the organizations named, other planning displays are Santa Cruz chapter, American Red Cross; Visiting Nurses association, Santa Cruz county schools, the local chapter of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, Santa Cruz County hospital, Santa Cruz County Heart association, Watsonville District Parent-Teachers association council, Santa Cruz County Redwood P-TA council and Pajaro Valley Health council.

The Health fair hours are: Wednesday, 1:30-5 p.m. and 6:30-8:30 p.m.; Thursday and Friday, 10 a.m.-4 p.m., and Saturday, 9 a.m.-noon.

The building, located near the county hospital, is at 10 Emeline avenue.

The public is invited to inspect the new home. While it is not furnished, it has been equipped with the complete built-in General Electric kitchen, Timms added.

Timms said several other homes will be built in the area in the near future. The model home itself has already been sold and three other sites have already been sold for immediate construction of homes by Kingham.
