

Five-Year Plan

County Approves Revised Bikeway Proposal

The county board of supervisors, in a unanimous 5-0 decision, voted Tuesday morning to pass a revised five-year proposal for the construction and maintenance of 19 bikeways in Santa Cruz County.

The estimated construction budget for the bikeways will be \$216,000 for 1977-78 and \$150,000 for each of the next four years, bringing the total five-year expenditure to \$816,000.

Earlier this year, the board reviewed the initial plan and then directed the public works department to make several revisions in the proposal.

The revised plan returned

from public works allowed for more money than in the initial budget, as well as the addition of four new projects not included in the first proposal.

The added projects would be the construction of bikeways on Freedom Boulevard, Soquel Avenue, Lockwood Lane in Scotts Valley and Treetop

Drive from Simms Road to Graham Hill Road.

Elizabeth Schilling, representing the bicycle subcommittee, suggested to the board that the \$20,000 currently planned for the construction of the Treetop Drive bikeway be used instead for the planned San Andreas Road bikeway, also

included in the proposal.

According to the bicycle subcommittee, the low level of automobile traffic on Treetop Drive "does not justify delaying work to upgrade more dangerous bicycle routes." The subcommittee feels that primary transportation routes, such as San Andreas Road, be given

"the first consideration."

Supervisors Cecil Smith and Gary Patton suggested earlier in the meeting that further dis-

cussion of the bikeways be postponed because of the time element involved in the proposed plan.
