Broken, Battered, Beached

Broken and battered, the remains of the 65-foot ship Golden Dragon lie on the Santa Cruz main beach, after it dragged its anchor in 35-knot winds Friday night. Owned by Ralph Ditaillo of Los Gatos, it was about the same size as the ill-fated Shamrock IV, which went aground in nearly the same spot in 1972. A second ship, the 37foot trimaran Galitea, owned by Bob Mason, was saved by the Coast Guard when it was pulled away from Capitola's seawall Friday night. It, too, had dragged its anchor in high winds and heavy seas.
