> The Smith case may be only the first of several court tests, the youth's mother indicated, she stated that a number of parents are planning to test the code. She also stated that the Francisco office of the American Civil Liberties Union has been contacted for legal assistance.

Mrs. Smith said the ACLU's help will be needed if court action becomes necessary, because the Smiths cannot afford all of the legal expenses that would be involved. The boy's father is a former warrant officer in the U.S. Army who retired after 21 years of service.
