
Aerial View Of Ohtas' Gutted Home



This aerial photograph of the Victor M. Ohta home taken Wednesday by Sentinel Chief Photographer Pete Amos shows the destruction that resulted from the fire Monday night. The home was deliberately set ablaze, according to the Sheriff's department, by the slayers of Dr. Ohta,
