Council gives green light 3.8.75 to parking lot acquisition; split develops over money Capitala - 1970 - 1979

Capitola City Manager Max Kludt was told Tuesday night by city councilmen to start dickering for parking lots in the Capitola Village area.

Kludt was also given the goahead in a special study session to hire an appraiser to prepare a study on the property.

But the countil split on the amount of money it's willing to spend this year on municipal parking lots.

Councilmen John Dixon and Michael Routh favored setting aside \$15,000 for the appraisals and options on available land in the village.

Councilman Ron Graves objected vehemently to establishing any dollar amount at this point. saying he wanted to wait until next Monday night when the council will hold a public hearing on the budget.

He reiterated an earlier concern that the city will be engaging in deficit spending this year, a position at odds with that of Dixon.

The council now plans a public hearing next Monday, 7:30 p.m., of \$52 a month for Blue Cross prein the city hall on the budget.

Kludt has estimated a 1975-76 vear-end balance of \$496,177 and 1976-77 income of \$1,010,315; a total of \$1,506,486.

With the completion of the city hall addition and reconstruction of Capitola Road between 41st and Wharf Road, included in the budget, Kludt wants council approval to spend \$1,364,265 next year.
