Barbara, the daughter of Ted and Betty Bowen of Aptos, was born in Long Beach and has lived here since she was 3 (her dad has been a physics instruc-tor at Cabrillo College) except for two years in Central Africa in Malawi.

"I was 10 when we went to Malawi where Dad taught in a polytechnic college under the

U.S. AID program.
"I never really thought that this experience influenced me a great deal — somehow at that age you just take things for granted. But now I remember the people over there who were starving. Here in America, we're so far away most of us don't have to think of that.

"But my decision to go into the Peace Corps I'm sure is directly related to my ex-periences in Africa and my realization that it is important to help others."

But back to her immediate goal of pageant competition. Barbara says she entered the county pageant because of its fine scholarship program and will use her \$1000 scholarship to

complete her college education. She's quick to add, however, that she appreciates the many other benefits. "I have gained so much self-confidence. I know lot more about myself, and I've met so many really nice

people."
With the hard work of all of the county pageant's board of directors including pageant ex-ecutive director, Janice Todd Allegri, as well as the coopera-tion of local merchants, this year's scholarship is the largest

Barbara also is enjoying all of the the new clothes which go along with the title.

Although her major at San Jose state is in liberal studies and she is taking a minor in biological sciences ("I always have been interested in how things work from body func-tions to astronomy"), she earned a vocal scholarship at Cabrillo and has sung pro-fessionally. Now she is studying with Patti Macdonald and for the pageant competition will sing a ballad, "Com in from the

Rain."

Among family members who will be attending the pageant will be her sister, Diana, who graduates this month from UCSC, and her brother, Gary, in Valencia Elementary School.

"I'd love to become Miss California," she says, "but realistically speaking, there will be 30 other just as attractive

"My dad is ill with cancer and if I am in the top 10 he'll be able to see me on TV."

Cancer is an illness that Barbara knows all about. In 1975 she became ill and the

diagnosis was a Willms tumor of the kidney. After a year and a half of chemotherapy, plus radiation ("I lost a lot of hair")

she was pronounced cured.

"My illness has made me appreciate the little things that most people take for granted—
I'm thankful for each day. And have more awareness walk in the woods, running on the beach, playing tennis, seeing a flower unfold, hearing a child laugh, all mean so much."

A member of Cabrillo As-sembly of God Church, Barbara says that during her bout with cancer she became closer to God and also with the people of her church. "There was a bind-

"I'm sure all of this too, has had an effect on my plans for a career," says Barbara. And when you talk to her you know too that it has added depth to her character and she is facing life with calmness and with joy.

Barbara has learned a passage from the book ON DEATH AND DYING by Eliz-

aphrased it for me.
