

Western States Atomic Vaults Inc. Will Open Today

The vault, located at Zayante, and using a former Southern Pacific railroad tunnel, will be opened officially today between 1 and 2 p.m.

A part of the entrance tunnel to the Western States Atomic Vault at Zayante is pictured above. The vault has been con-

structed from reinforced concrete and steel, and occupies an old Southern Pacific railroad tunnel. It is designed for the storage of
