County budget revenues are up for discussion

Final revenues for the county's \$73 million budget are scheduled to be given county supervisors at their regular session Tuesday.

The board meets in Room 525, county center, beginning at 9 a.m.

The budget is the first item on the regular agenda and administrators were being close-mouthed this morning on final revenue figures.

It is known the slow payment of taxes (delinquency factor) will be up from its regular low of past years, around five percent, to 10-11 percent.

It will mean less money to be spent and could mandate some budget adjustments.

The county was in terrible shape this year and had to eliminate 150 positions, some of which were filled, necessitating layoffs.

During the afternoon planning session that begins at 1:30 p.m., the board will consider amendments to Olympia Quarry's permit. It comes up as the third item on the agenda and the public hearing on the issue is closed.

The next item is a public hearing on a 38 unit townhouse development at Capitola Road and Maciel Avenue in Live Oak. The project is called Begonia Gardens by Bogaard Construction for Peter Antonelli and others.
