Some Gifts for Young Readers


This past spring during a brief visit home, artist Jill Kostenko Fogelsong worked with the Santa Cruz Public Library, the Santa Cruz Sentinel and the Santa Cruz County Bank to make available locally her wildlife lithographs of a Bengal tiger and an African leopard.

Jill specified that \$10 from the price of each sale be given to the library's Children's Department for the purchase of wildlife books. As well as money for books, now amounting to \$410, Jill also presented the two framed lithographs which are hanging in the Children's Library.

According to Susan Elgin, children's librarian, the funds will be used to purchase books on bats, polar bears, sharks, buffalos, peacocks and reindeer as well as other subjects which soon will be appearing on the library shelves.

Jill reports that new lithographs of a lion and cheetah will be available in February or early March.
