Librarian's name lives on

Libraries 1980-1989

Friends of Santa Cruz Public Library has announced the establishment of a special collection at the main branch in Santa Cruz to honor the late Geraldine Jane Work, who served nearly 40 years as the city-county librarian.

Mrs. Work was offered the job as librarian shortly before Miss Minerva Waterman retired in 1941. Miss Waterman has been the head librarian for 50 years, and Mrs. Work continued longterm service, retiring in 1969.

A graduate of the University of Southern California School of Librarianship, Mrs. Work had held several library positions throughout the state before she came to Santa Cruz. During the years of her direction, plans were made to replace the old library building with the present central library at 224 Church St., Santa Cruz.

Mrs. Work was well-known in local business and social circles, and local and California history was a favorite hobby. The Geraldine Work Room at the Santa Cruz Public Library will include both local and

regional history, and will be an extension of the present California collection.

Friends of Santa Cruz Library has donated \$1,000 for the collection, and plans to make additional

donations for future expansion.

The special collection room will be dedicated by the Santa Cruz City-County Library Board of Trustee at 4 p.m. Sunday at the library,

and the program is open to the public.
