## Carmel man gets jail for Aptos burglaries

A Carmel man who pleaded find guilty to burglarizing three Aptos homes has been sentenced to a pyear in jail and placed on probation for three years.

The sentence was imposed in Santa Cruz Superior Court on Jason Thomas Buckles, 19, who burglarized homes on Lupin Valley Road, Farr Avenue and Baker Road in May.

Buckles' co-defendant, David Ramirez, 18, of Monterey was sentenced to seven years in prison earlier this month. Ramirez was on probation when he was arrested for the burglaries. In other Superior Court cases:

• Alfred Arellano,, who was placed on probation last year for robbing a gas station, was sentenced to 10 years in prison for violating probation by leaving a residential drug program. Arellano was arrested in Watsonville after he robbed a Santa Cruz gas station.

● Charles Wallace Johnson, 46, a Watsonville transient, was placed on probation and ordered to enter a drug program. He was caught shoplifting at Orchard Supply Hardware in Watsonville and Albertson's in Freedom.
