

Supervisors decide how to spend road money

SANTA CRUZ — If the road outside your home is in dire need of repair it's time to call your county supervisor.

Between now and Friday, supervisors will be deciding how to spend additional funds that are available to repair roads damaged during the last two winters.

Some \$369,000 has been added to the \$8 million road repair program adopted by supervisors in June.

Some \$204,332 became available when the bid for road resurfacing and repairs came in

lower than expected.

Supervisors decided Tuesday to allocate \$75,500 of this additional money to the north county and \$128,500 to roads in the mid-county. They gave themselves until Friday to decide which roads.

Third (Santa Cruz) District Supervisor Gary Patton and Fifth (San Lorenzo Valley-Scotts Valley) District Supervisor Joe Cucchiara will get together to decide on additional road repairs in the north county.

First (Live Oak-Soquel) District Supervisor

Dan Forbus and Second (Capitola-Aptos) District Supervisor Robley Levy also will try to agree on how to spend the \$128,500 going to mid-county roads.

The north county and mid-county road repair zones were set up recently by supervisors when they instituted a county service area for road repairs.

Fourth (Pajaro Valley) District Supervisor E. Wayne Moore Jr. didn't get any of the \$204,332 because his district isn't generating any money.
