

# Unload Pontoons For Test Groin

A carload of 18 pontoons was unloaded yesterday from Stokely's railroad siding, to pile up on the beach. Alto-

gether 54 pontoons will go into construction of the test barrier. Unloading under the supervision of Street Superintendent Dop Bruce will resume tomorrow. The 275-foot groin is to be built to test effects of a permanent barrier on beach erosion and the proposed small craft harbor channel at Woods lagoon.
