Constructed primarily of adobe brick and pumice block the new structure combines modern and Spanish mission architec-

ture throughout. The front wall is natural adobe studded with fluted columns of colored glass. The north wall is also of adobe with the remaining walls plas-tered in beige and off-white. The roof is constructed over exposed beams and features accoustical tile and the light wells over the working area to let in natural light.


