

Will Frenchy's Go Straight?

Will Frenchy's K&T adult bookstore go straight?

If so, what does straight mean?

Those questions may be answered in August when owner Earl Kuhns will be allowed to reapply with the county to operate a "regular" bookstore.

Kuhns has been fighting the county and courts for more than a year to open an adult bookstore on Portola Drive.

In response to citizen complaints that the bookstore had opened anyway, Sheriff Al Noren made a visit to the sneak preview Wednesday and ordered the doors closed.

After an undercover deputy entered and purchased two adult magazines, Noren walked in and handed Kuhns a copy of the injunction issued in February and ordered the store closed.

According to Assistant Coun-

ty Counsel Terry Slocum, Kuhns later Wednesday attempted to apply for a permit to operate a "regular" bookstore on the premises.

County code, Slocum said, requires an applicant to wait one year after a permit is denied to apply again. Kuhn's last application to operate an adult bookstore was made and rejected last August.

In the meantime, Slocum said, Kuhn will be charged with contempt of a court order if he opens the store again.
