'Bookstore' Law Upheld

The constitutionality of a county ordinance which sets out requirements for carnally-oriented business was upheld by a state appeals court, it was announced today.

The state Court of Appeals Friday refused to overturn Superior Court Judge Hall's ruling that the ordinance was constitutional, according to Terry Slocum, assistant county counsel.

It also refused to order the court to issue a permit to adult bookstore owner Earl Stanley Kuhns for placement of a book-

store on Portola Drive, Slocum said.

Kuhns will have a second chance to overturn the ruling however, since an appeal of the decision is still pending in the appeals court, said Slocum.

Kuhns filed two challenges to the ordinance. The first requested that the appeals court overturn Hall's ruling and issue a permit.

The county ordinance requires space is necessary between carnally-oriented businesses such as massage parlors and adult bookstores.
