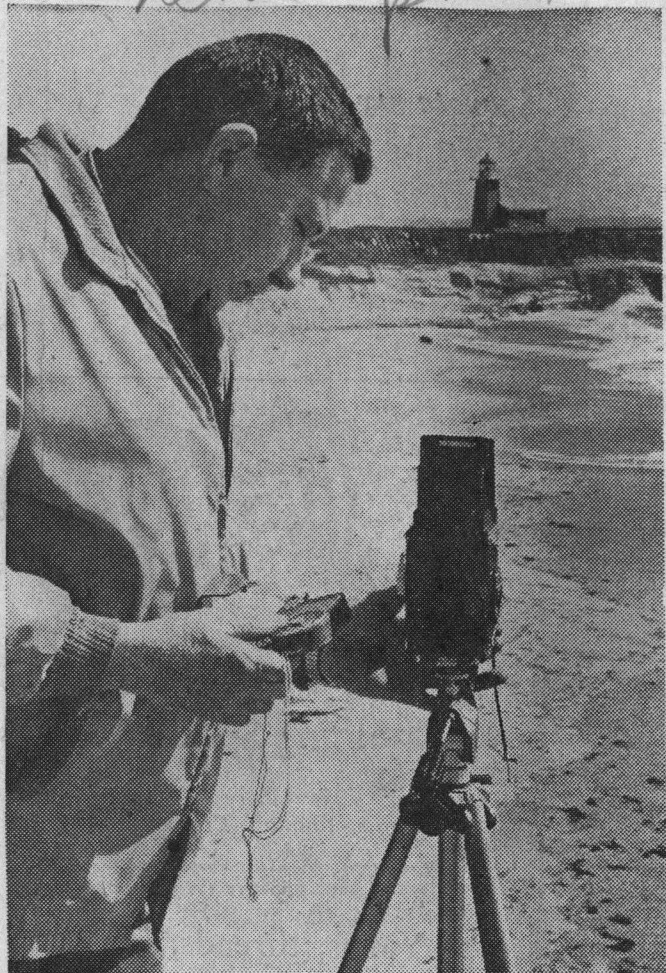

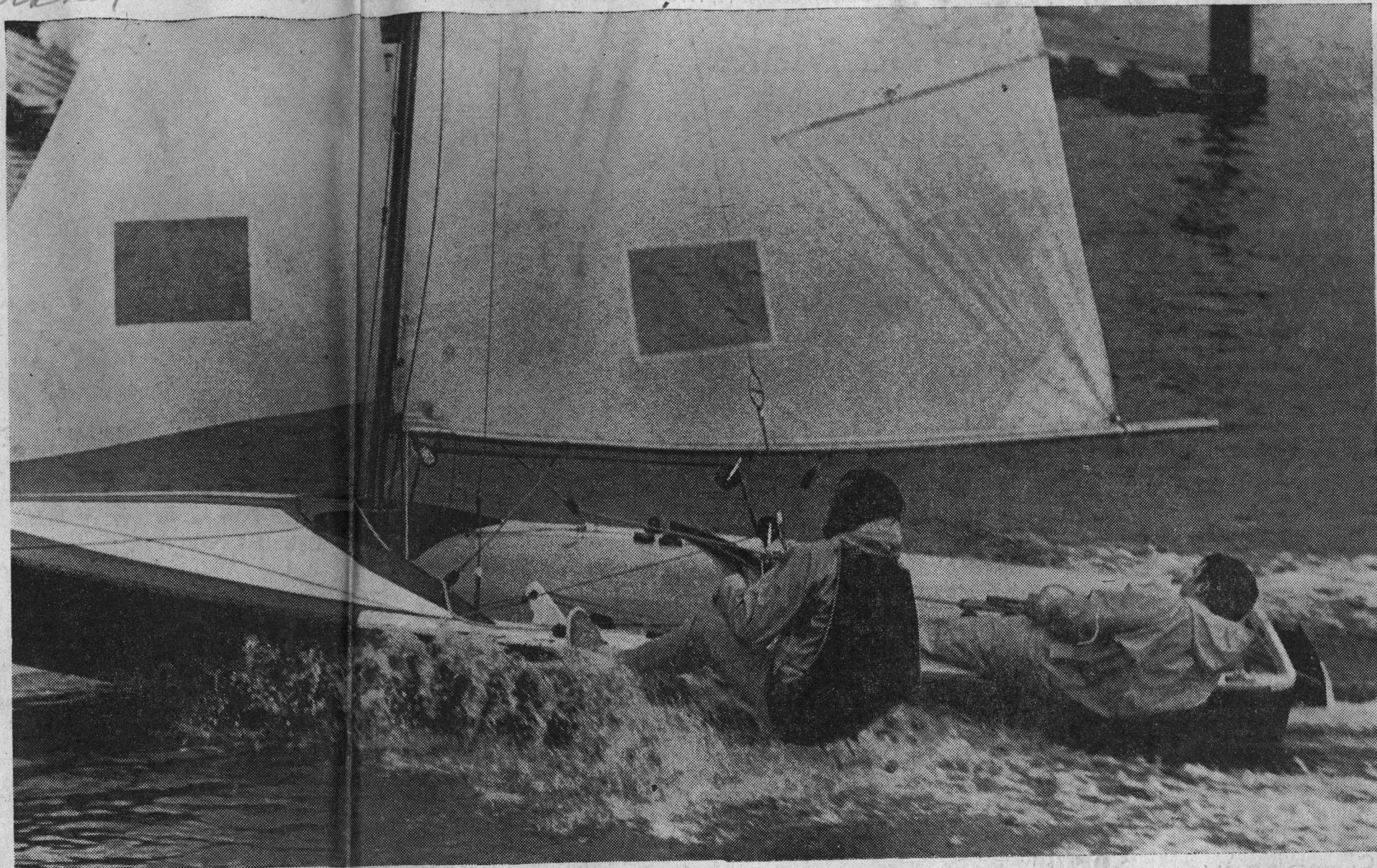
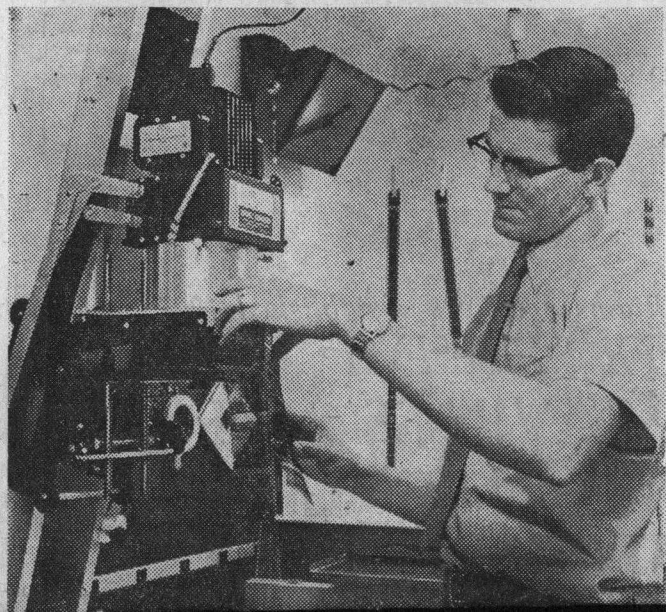


Photo '70
