Recommend Traffic Changes For Beach Intersection

Want Islands, Stop Signs For Depot Area

Revision of traffic engineering at the intersection of West Cliff drive, Washington street, and Pacific avenue extension has been recommended by the California State Automobile association in its survey of local traffic conditions.

City Manager R. N. Klein said today the organization recommended installation of islands, stop signs, and enforced double-lines to prevent accident at the intersection.

Under the plan, cars driving from West Cliff drive into the intersection, and from Pacific avenue into Washington street, must come to a full stop. A free right turn will be permitted from the beach into Pacific avenue, with an island furnishing separation of lanes.

Barriers would be built to block off the Southern Pacific company property from the thoroughfare, with entrances provided for access to the station and to the Crossroads restaurant. No parking would be permitted at curbs immediately adjacent to the intersection.

The plan will be taken up by the traffic bureau of the police department for submission to the council.
