Last year's grand prize winners, the Riverview Rascals, plan a biplane float. Their \$1,000 donation prize from 2008 went to Vista Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired.

The festival returns to the lagoon with Monday's fishing derby for early risers, starting at 6 a.m.
