## Annual Daisy Faire celebrates Girl Scouts

The annual Girl Scout Daisy Faire will be held Saturday, March 12, at the Santa Cruz Civic Auditorium from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

The Faire, which is being held on the 71st birthday of Girl Scouts of the USA, begins at 11 a.m. with a parade of more than 600 Girl Scouts. The parade begins at the auditorium and will travel down Church, Cedar, Lincoln, the Pacific Garden Mall, Locust and return to the auditorium via Center Street. The girls will be marching in uniform or costume and some will be riding on floats. Music will be provided by the San Lorenzo Valley Junior High School Band.

Participating in the parade will be Chuck E. Cheese and Jasper Jowels of the Pizza Time Theatre, the Antique Auto Club of America, I-You Venture, United Way and other civic groups. Co-grand marshalls for this year's parade are Glenna Harlamoff and Joyce Finch, senior troop 1106 advisors.

This year's theme is "Good Times - Good Friends," submitted by Brownie Troop 4005, Alianza School in Watsonville. The Brownie Troop received an award for its winning theme and will lead the parade.

The Daisy Faire gets its name from the

founder of Girl Scouting in this country, Juliette Gordon Low. She was known as "Daisy" to her friends.

The Daisy Faire, which is free and open to the public, features booths and displays of county wide Girl Scout activities and accomplishments ranging from career planning, folk dancing and water conservation to origami, face painting and more.
