An extremely low four per cent of the registered voters had cast ballots by noon today, according to a spot check of precincts by The Sentinel.

Lack of issues appears to be keeping the voters away, although contested elections prevail in most of the districts. County Clerk Tom Kelley has predicted a turnout of 34 per cent of the registered 40,649 voters in the county.

## **Funds Asked** For Beaches

Governor Brown has included \$1 million for land purchases in the Twin Lakes Schwan Lake and Bonita lagoon areas in a \$19.1 mil-lion 1963-64 budget request for the state beach and park system. Everett Powell, supervisor of acquisition for the State Division of Beaches and Parks, said this

Powell said the Powell said the request involves approximately 50 acres which are now in private ownership. He indicated the land involved is all of Bonita Lagoon, in the vicinity of 14th avenue; the beach down to Schwan Lake beach, and on to Twin Lakes beach land presently owned by the state. request inthe state.
