Chaminade School

School Excluded From Capitola's Sewer District

Approximately 38 acres of property owned by the Chaminade Preparatory school was excluded Monday from the mid-county area proposed for annexation to the Capitola sanitation district.

The board of supervisors unanimously approved the request for exclusion that came in a letter from Father Stefanelli of the school. Exclusion was granted on the basis the school will not need sewers proposed for the annexed area.

For the second time the hearing was continued. It will come up again next Monday morning when the board is expected to approve a resolution for annexation.

Engineer Harold Bare of the Bowman-Williams Engineering firm, which is handling the project, pointed out that the large Santa Cruz Gardens subdivision would be included in the annexation.

Territory proposed for annexation covers from the Capitola city limits to the northern boundary of the Soquel Rancho tract. Monterey Bay heights is included. Much of the area is undeveloped.
