■ SEPT. 14, 1941: Sisters Hospital opens on West Cliff Drive.

■ 1949: Dominican Santa Cruz Hospital, with 49 beds, opens on Soquel Avenue, where Branciforte Plaza is today.

DEC. 26, 1967: The two facilities unite in a 150-bed hospital at the current ISoquel Drive site.

■ 1988: Dominican Hospital becomes member of Catholic Healthcare West, a system that today has more than 40 hospitals in California, Nevada and Arizona.

■ 1990: Dominican acquires AMI Hospital on Frederick Street, which today houses stroke rehabilitation, lifestyle management and sports medicine programs.

■ 1992: Dominican begins participating in the Malcolm
