Services will be Monday for J. Frank Murphy Sr., former county district attorney and Santa Cruz city attorney, who died Thursday at a local convalescent


home. He was 80.

Born in Aptos, Mr. Murphy went to Aptos Grammar School and Watsonville High School. He obtained his law degree from the University of California.

In 1930, at age 28, he was elected county district attorney. At that time, he was the youngest district attorney in the state.

After serving a term, Mr. Murphy returned to private practice. From 1943 to 1954, he served as Santa Cruz city attorney.

During his legal career in Santa Cruz, Mr. Murphy was active in many fraternal and pro-
