Teachers Management, Inc., owners of the property, are currently meeting with hotel firms.

Yudelson told city councilmen later that the convention center will be leased back to the city, and the city has obligated itself to pay any deficits from the center for the next 48 years. Yudelson filed with with the council petitions conaining 376 signatures against the Lighthouse Point site.
