New City Clerk Named

Veteran city employe Angele Mellon has been appointed Santa Cruz city clerk, it was announced today by Councilwoman Lorette Wood.

Mrs. Wood headed a committee which included Councilmen Norman Walters and Ernest Wicklund to make the appointment.

The appointment will become effective Tuesday upon the retirement of City Clerk-Finance Director Jack Miller. Miller's department will be split into two separate sections—finance and records — upon his leaving the city.

Charles Hill of Roseville has been hired as the city's finance director.

Mrs. Mellon came to work for the city in 1941 as a cashier-clerk in the water department. She later worked as Miller's secretary and in 1947 was appointed deputy city clerk and deputy treasurer. She also was

appointed to the position of senior secretary.

She lives with her husband, Realtor Ronald Mellon, at 145 Scenic Street. They have one

daughter, Mrs. Virginia Smith of Los Angeles, and three grandchildren.

Mrs. Mellon is Sunday school superintendent and a member of the board of directors of Unity Temple of Santa Cruz. She is a past matron of Idylwild Chapter, Order of Eastern Star, and also served as deputy grand matron of Order of Eastern Star.

A native Santa Cruzan, she attended Branciforte School, Santa Cruz High School and Santa Cruz Business College.

Her official duties under the city charter will include keeping minutes of all council meetings, maintaining ordinance and resolution books, custody of the seal of the city, administering oaths, taking affidavits and depositions, certifying copies of all official records and administering city elections.

Her salary has been set at \$800 per month.
