The financial picture was substantially aided last year by one-time unexpected revenues. including cigarette taxes and the stepping up of collections on sales tax.

Sufficient funds are set aside to increase the general reserve account to \$100,000 and create a cushion for the dry period from July through December until property taxes begin to come in.

Other funds are set aside to create an emergency reserve fund to guard against financial disaster such as the 1955 flood.
