Status Report On Santa Cruz County Highways

(Editor's Note: Following is a newsletter from J. P. Sinclair. assistant state highway engineer for this district, reporting on status of highways April 1. It is of interest to persons concerned with state highway development in the county in the relatively near future.)


A \$1.37 million project for the construction of interchanges at Park avenue and at State Park drive has been underway since November. This is the second project to convert Sign Route 1 from expressway to full freeway between Rob Roy junction and Santa Cruz and includes the construction of frontage roads between Soquel Wharf road and Aptos creek.

The work is approximately 27 per cent complete and the contract is expected to be opened to traffic late this year. Recent inclement weather has delayed grading operations and the contractor is now constructing drainage facilities as well as erecting girders for the State Park drive overcrossing.

A project for tree planting at State Park drive, Park avenue and 41st avenue interchanges, when the above construction has been completed, is currently under design study.

Studies also are in progress for the design of interchanges at Rio del Mar boulevard and Rob Roy junction, including frontage roads and the future addition of two lanes to the existing four-lane facility between Santa Cruz and Rob Roy junction.

The conversion of the existing facility between Rob Roy junction and two miles northerly of Watsonville to an initial four-lane (ultimate six-lane) facility also is under design study. It is anticipated that funds for these projects will not be available until after 1967.

passing Watsonville to the west. The initial work includes the placing of an embankment surcharge on the graded area to assist in the stabilization of the embankment through this marshy terrain. The surcharge will remain in place for approximately one year. The project also includes rough grading on portions of Route 67 from the new alignment on Sign Route 1 to Main street in Watsonville.

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A project is being readied in design for the removal of the surcharge, paving four lanes of the ultimate six-lane freeway, and completing the structures between the Monterey county line and 0.2 miles northwest of Roach road. This work will include interchanges at Route 67, Harkins Slough road and Route 32, and paving the Route 67 connection to Main street.

Design studies are in progress for about three miles of four-lane freeway, including interchanges, between the new alignment of Sign Route 1, west of Watsonville road and one mile east of Casserly road on State Route 152. This new alignment for Hecker Pass road northerly of Watsonville was adopted on August 4, 1961.

Design studies also are being made to extend Chittenden Pass road (Legislative Route 67) westerly from its intersection with existing State Sign Route 1 to the new location along Watsonville bypass. A portion of this work will be included in the contract for paving and completion of structures on Sign Route 1 which is discussed above.

A contract was completed on January 31, 1963 for the modification of signal systems at five major intersections in Watsonville on existing Sign Routes 1 and 152 and Legislative Route 67. This work cost approximately \$24,500.
