Board To Study Resolution On Small Craft Harbor Plans

Supervisors were scheduled to consider this afternoon a resolution authorizing the chamber of commerce small craft harbor committee to prepare tentative plans for a small craft harbor at Twin Lakes.

The board, which has been requested to submit to the state by July 1 an outline of proposed harbor development, agreed informally yesterday to consider the recommendations of the chamber committee, headed this year by Don Falconer.

A formal resolution giving Fal-

coner's committee the go-ahead was to be placed on this afternoon's board agenda.

The plan of the committee, which has been a leader in the movement to obtain a small craft harbor in Woods lagoon, will reach the board through the city and county planning commissions.

The agreement to let the committee carry the ball initially was reached yesterday at a conference between supervisors, City Manager Robert Klein and Ralph Ring, secretary-manager of the chamber.

Behind the renewed activity on the small craft harbor front is a communication addressed to the board by Rufus Putnam, executive officer of the state lands commission.

Putnam requested Santa Cruz county—and all other counties interested in shoreline planning—to come up with county-wide harbor development plans by July 1.

The harbor ambitions of each county will be woven by the state into a state-wide plan for small craft harbors and shoreline development.

Each county has been told to come up with maps showing proposed harbors, data justifying their need and an estimate of costs.

If the board goes along with the informal understanding reached yesterday, the brunt of supplying the requisites listed by Putnam will fall on the shoulders of the chamber committee.

Citations To Be Issued To Fire-Watchers

An abandoned garage converted into a three room home on the 3500 block of Gross road in Live Oak was destroyed by fire last night.

Onlookers who hindered the fire fighting by blocking Gross road with their automobiles will be issued citations, declared Howard Hansen, chief of the Live Oak fire department. He said that he plans to recommend the necessary action to the California highway patrol.

The fire occurred at 5:15 p.m. and gutted an abandoned building, reported Hansen. He said the cause of the blaze was undetermined but youths who frequently play in the garage are believed to have started the fire.
