

# State And County Sign Contract To Improve Boulder Creek's Highway Storm Drainage Issue

Supervisors entered into an agreement yesterday with the state division of highways to correct long time storm drainage problems in the town of Boulder Creek not later than November 1, 1952.

The resolution adopted by the board of supervisors provides that the state will supply conduits or other methods of carrying the water on state rights-of-way on state highway 116 at Lomond street, Forest street and West Park avenue, all in Boulder Creek.

The county agrees to provide the means and funds to take the waters from the state rights-of-way to the San Lorenzo river. Either open or closed conduits may be used, Fred R. Pracht, county road commissioner, said.

The state agreed to maintain its part of the area and the county the section between the highway and the river.

In other actions supervisors:

Set April 8 at 2 p. m. as the time for hearing on the application of Paul Teilh for a dance permit.

Passed the third reading and adopted an ordinance amending the salary ordinance allowing \$10 overtime pay for resident doctors at the county hospital.

Granted Reuben Calic, honorably discharged veteran, a free salesman's license, according to provisions of the Business and Professional code.

Adopted two recommendations of the county planning commission accepting the record of survey map of a part of Casserly road in the Watsonville area, and a record of survey map of the G. T. Harding subdivision, the Stevenson tract, in the San Lorenzo valley, with conditions effective as approved by the commission.

Granted the city of Santa Cruz permission to consolidate its municipal election with the primary election to be held in the county June 3.

Accepted a deed to the county for land needed for county highway purposes.

Referred to the county road commissioner a communication from the Pajaro district containing nine signatures asking that the Paulsen road be repaired.

Also referred to the road commissioner a communication from Frank A. Bricker, district superintendent of the Live Oak school, protesting the condition of the road paralleling the school house.

Filed with the board a communication from the San Lorenzo Valley Property Owners association suggesting a permanent by-pass on State Highway 9 between Ben Lomond and Brookdale. Contents of the letter were previously carried by the Sentinel-News.

Adopted a resolution transferring \$10 from the unappropriated reserve to the board of supervisors' budget, for extra help.

Cancelled \$250 in the budget of the treasurer and tax collector and

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transferred it to capital outlay for shelves and trays in the same office budget.

Adopted a resolution allowing \$1330 for extra help for the treasurer and tax collector and the agricultural commissioner and the county hospital.

Confirmed the appointment of T. Lester Burns as justice of the peace of the Santa Cruz township replacing W. A. Deans, retired, effective April 7.

Held over until the next meeting a request of Supervisor Frank Clement for a transfer of \$100 in the budget of the Santa Cruz township constable for a changeover of his one-way radio in order to avail himself of the sheriff's new transmitter. Supervisors first wanted to determine who owned the set in question.

Were informed by District Attorney June D. Borina that despite the changeover to the new municipal court system in January, 1952, the constables will remain in office until the end of their elective terms, or until 1954.

Approved a minute order allowing the city of Capitola to be connected with the sheriff's new radio system at the cost of \$25 per month for maintenance and service for one car.
