Carpenter is accused in Santa Cruz County of killing Ellen Marie Hansen and of trying to murder her companion, Steven Haertle, March 29 on a popular hiking trail in Henry Cowell Redwoods State Park. He is also charged with the death of Heather Scaggs, whose body was found in Big Basin May 24.

Besides the Santa Cruz County charges, Carpenter faces five major counts and 13 special allegations in Marin County where the socalled trailside killings allegedly began.

While the preliminary examination is being conducted behind locked doors at the request of defense attorneys, the murder suspect was seen writing notes on a legal pad as District Attorney Art Danner spoke to the court.

Carpenter has changed his appearance somewhat since his arrest by growing his hair and beard and sporting glasses.

The hearing is expected to last two weeks.


