## SC Officials Learn Details On Obligations To UC Campus

Santa Cruz officials came out of a long, trying meeting with University of California repre-sentatives at Berkeley yesterday with some compromise and a clearer understanding of their ob-ligations in the Cowell campus development.

Proposed agreements for all phases of city and county partici-pation will be turned over to attorneys for legal phrasing.

City and county attorneys also will begin work on "freeze" legislation to arrest development of areas surrounding the proposed 1918-acre south central coast 1918-acre south campus at the northerly city lim-

In the meantime, the local plan-ners will begin preliminary work on a community development plan for areas outside the actual camp-us. This must be coordinated with plans for campus development.

City Manager Peter Tedesco said this morning there is a def-inite responsibility to proceed with the campus and community planning as quickly as possible so that hardship is limited on owners of the "frozen" properties.

The six-hour session, broken by lunch and a short Berkeley camp-us tour, included the following points of compromise or classification.

ROADS—The university staff indicated it would consider using peripheral roads to be developed by the county as campus boundaries in areas where forcing the roads outside the original "take lines" would make construction infeasible.

The possibility of an easement for realignment of Empire Grade across the southerly side of the campus area was left open to negotiation, according to Elmer Swan, acting road commissioner.

The university staff ruled out any possibility it would purchase right of way outside the univer-sity area, including the proposed "fishhook" connection with Highway 17.
