Aged Veteran Is Taken to Final Rest

The fast thinning ranks of local G. A. R. men figured yesterday afternoon in impressive, though simple and beautiful funeral services over a late comrade, when Wallace Reynolds post paid solemn tribute to the last mortal remains of James K. Fields, at the Wessendorf mortuary chapel. Grouped before the bier, the steadily decreasing company carried out the touching ceremony, being represented by about fourteen individuals.

Words of comfort and cheer to the bereaved relatives were included in the prayer and service by Rev. J. N. Hoover, who spoke preceding the G. A. R. ceremony, and again at the open grave.

Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Pierce, of San Francisco, with Mrs. Alfred Bowman as accompanist, sang beautifully, the hymns, "Jesus, I Come" and "Face to Face."

The floral offerings were profuse and strikingly beautiful.

A long line of friends, neighbors and former acquaintances filed past the remains to pay homage, before the funeral cortege proceeded to Oakwood cemetery where interment was made.

The pall-bearers, all Grand Army comrades of the deceased, were Wm. Brown, J. W. Smith, W. R. Sargent, L. M. Tucker, A. J. Hostreder and J. Slaven.
