Special Bus Service To SC In Effect For The Summer

Special summer season Greyhound bus service between Santa Cruz and San Francisco now is in full operation, according to C. L. Hughes, local Greyhound representative.

In addition to daily service by way of coastal points and the Skyline Boulevard route, the company is providing on Fridays only direct service from San Francisco to Santa Cruz to enable San Francisco men to join their families vacationing here.

The coastside route bus leaves Santa Cruz daily at 12:30 p.m., providing intermediate service to Davenport, Half Moon Bay, Montara and Sharp Park before arriving in San Francisco at 2:45 p.m.

The Skyline route departure from Santa Cruz is at 3:30 p.m., with intermediate service to Felton, Ben Lomond, Brookdale, Boulder Creek, Saratoga Gap, Skyllonda and Crystal Springs Dam. Arrival in San Francisco is at 5:45 p.m.

Daily San Francisco departure for Santa Cruz by the coast route is at 8:45 a.m., with arrival here at 11 a.m. The Skyline bus leaves San Francisco at 9:30 a.m. and gets to Santa Cruz at 11:50 a.m.

The added Friday night-only direct service bus leaves San Francisco at 8:30 p.m., travels by way of Los Gatos and arrives here at 10:23 p.m.

Burglary Suspect Trapped

Santa Cruz police conducted a stake-out last night which resulted in the arrest of Nathan Lovato, 18, of 115 Morrissey Boulevard, on a burglary-conspiracy charge.

Detectives said they had word from an informant that Lovato was going to take money from Bond's Chevron Service Station, 2227 Mission Street. Detectives said Lovato formerly worked at the station.

Seven officers took part in the stake-out. Two were posted in a pick-up camper parked near the station. Detectives said

they saw Lovato drive up in an automobile, get out and go into the station. They said he picked up an envelope in the office and began moving towards his automobile.

Lovato surrendered when officers came out of the camper at gunpoint. Detectives said the envelope contained \$174.

Lovato was to be arraigned on the felony charge in Municipal Court today. A hold was also placed on him, as he is on probation on a charge of possessing stolen property, officials said.
