Bonny Doon Writer Donates**UCSC Library To Get
Science Fiction Papers**

Robert Heinlein, Bonny Doon resident and master science fiction writer, has given his library of papers, type scripts, novels, first editions and other volumes to the UCSC Library.

Although not yet complete, the Heinlein collection includes 17 typescripts of manuscripts and 87 of his works, many of which are foreign editions. The core of the collection will include 156 manuscripts of works completed, several hundred science fiction novels, and a general library of about 3000 volumes.

Also to be included, said University Librarian Donald Clark,

are royalty and sales reports, contracts with publishers and producers, an assignments and copyrights file, and a working opus file on 3x5 cards which shows a complete history of each story or novel.

The Heinlein materials will be housed in the new headquarters of special collections on the third floor of the university library. An exhibit is planned soon.

According to Clark, the gift is an invaluable asset to the scholar and writer who is interested not only in the art of writing but also in the behind the scenes aspects of the profession.

Heinlein was born in Missouri in 1907 and was graduated from the U. S. Naval Academy in 1929, but retired from the Navy in 1934 because of disability incurred in line of duty.

He began writing in 1939, when he won a \$50 prize in a short story contest.

When received in its entirety, the collection will include papers relating to the writing process—notes, ballistics, calculations, diagrams, galley proofs, tear sheets, review clippings, and correspondence with editors, agents, publishers and producers.

WELSH WANT CHARLES
