four-pound bass and 14-inch trout, according to what they told him. Their tales only whetted his desire to land a few of his own.

The conditions at the reservoir are almost ideal for fishing. The water, while about 10 feet below the rim of the reservoir, is clear with 12-foot visibility.

"The rainfall is still below average, and the lake is a little lower than it typically is for this time of year," said Bill Ko-

cher, the city's water department director. "But it's not low enough that one would be thinking in terms of restrictions."

The park hours are from 6 a.m. until sunset — about 6 p.m. Entry fees are \$4 per car and \$1 to walk in. Canoes and other "car-top" boats are charged a \$2 launch fee, while boats on trailers are charged \$5.

The limits on fish are five trout, five bass, 20 catfish and all the sunfish you want, according to Cacace.
