The county has been granted an additional 21/2 acres for the an additional 2½ acres for the triangular shaped courthouse site, making a total of seven acres. Nelson reported the extra space will allow for more parking area, without further harming the San Lorenzo flood control project.

A shopping center has already been cut out of the park project with the courthouse going up on the site of the old Garibaldi hotel, he added.

The one-floor Spanish style structure will have its back to the San Lorenzo river, according to the San Francisco firm's plans. Cost of the courthouse and actual construction date has not been determined yet. Reid and his firm designed the San Lorenzo Valley high school.
