

Library Session ⁷⁻²⁻ Is Questioned ^{Sitting}

A Library Board quorum may or may not have violated the Brown Act June 13 while touring the technical services department of the Santa Cruz Main Library.

The tour or meeting was called by Sara Bunnett, Library Board chairwoman, who said this morning she had had a sidewalk consultation with William Rentz, assistant city attorney, on the legality of the meeting.

Rentz confirmed the consultation, telling The Sentinel: "I gave the OK in the assumption that the Library Board members would look at library, see how it is operated and with no business being conducted."

Legislative bodies are required by the Brown Act to give notice of regular or special meetings 24 hours in advance, executive sessions excepted when national security or personnel matters are involved or litigation is affected.

Bunnett's statement on whether business was conducted by the quorum at the tour or meeting was supported by others on the June 13 library visit.

Asked how the public knows this, Bunnett repeated no business was conducted.
