

Courthouse Site Decision Postponed Again By Board

The set of recommendations from the Santa Cruz County Grand Jurors association are still being studied individually by each member of the board of supervisors, Chairman Lewis Nelson said this morning.

Capping off the morning session of board work was the knotty courthouse issue. Realtor Ed Hansmann, who requested to be on the agenda, spoke again for action on the stack of petitions produced by the county-wide organization he heads to have the board look for a more economical site accessible to the Santa Cruz-Watsonville freeway.

The number of signatures edged up to 3208 when Hansmann presented another sheet with more signers.

Hansmann emphasized to the board that approximately 1500 signatures came from the Watsonville area. Persons in this sector are willing to sign their names to a bond issue that contains the provisions of the petition, he declared.

After the meeting Supervisor Francis Silliman said he does not intend to push for any action on the recommendations, and wants to wait until the matter is brought up by the chairman.

Tonight Supervisor Walter G. Merrill wants to get opinions from the members of the East Santa Cruz Businessmen's association on how they will be affected if the Santa Cruz urban redevelopment agency should put a commercial center in the area of the San Lorenzo park project the board wants for a courthouse.

The association has its annual dinner at Facelli's restaurant.

East Side businessmen may not be aware that a commercial center as planned by the URA agency at the downtown spot could affect their businesses, he declared.

This afternoon Merrill said he may propose to the board that a committee check out the legality of the deed giving 100 acres to the state in DeLaveaga park for the National Guard. Claiming the county was "bamboozled out of the land, he feels that a committee composed of County Clerk Tom Kelley, County Counsel Bill Card and one supervisor should check out the 1901 deed.

Merrill said that this move has nothing to do with a courthouse site and he has always believed that the county should try and reclaim ownership.
