Supervisors delay vote on growth, nuclear freeze

Two politically-sensitive issues — the setting of the 1983 county growth rate and support of the bilateral nuclear weapons freeze initiative — were delayed by county supervisors Tuesday until next week.

The issues were delayed until next Tuesday because of the absence of liberal Supervisor Joe Cucchiara from this week's meeting.

With two liberal and two conservative supervisors at the meeting, it was generally understood that consideration of these two items would be fruitless since it probably would be impossible to get a majority vote on either.

Supervisors' Chairman Robley Levy is proposing a resolution in support of the bilateral nuclear weapons freeze on the Nov. 2 ballot. Conservative Supervisors Dan Forbus and E. Wayne Moore Jr. indicated Tuesday they would oppose the resolution.
