Court Of Seven Seas Unveiled At Large Press Conference

The Court of the Seven Seas, a world community unparalleled in modern civilization, was off to a flying start yesterday at its official unveiling.

Plans for the \$13 million motel-hotel and International Village were presented to approximately 125 members of the press, radio and TV media at a conference-luncheon at the Riverside hotel.

The conference was presided over by James Hammond, manager of the Greater Santa Cruz Chamber of Commerce. Hammond introduced Peter J. Pasetta, developer of the West Cliff drive project, and an impressive list of dignitaries.

Sitting at the head table were such personalities as Dr. Marion Richards, foreign student advisor, San Jose State college; Dr. Walter Crafford, professor of marketing, San Jose State; Dr. Samuel I. Hayakawa, semanticist, San Francisco State college; William Wesley Peters, chief architect, Taliesin Associated architects; Eugene Masselink, secretary, Frank Lloyd Wright foundation, and Robert Lydecker, commercial officer, Belgian Consulate General, San Francisco.

Santa Cruz officials attending the event include City Manager Peter Tedesco, outgoing-Mayor John Daly, Robert W. Phol, chairman, city planning commission; Kay Dillon, manager, convention and visitors bureau, Santa Cruz Chamber.

A movie showing plans, developed by Peters, the Taliesin architects and the Frank Lloyd

Wright association was screened. The film, color and sound, also presented the many advantages of Santa Cruz and the reasons why Pasetta selected the site for his project.

Following the movie, Pasetta and his associates answered questions from the press about the project.

Pasetta stressed the project will be privately financed and will not resort to public stock or bond sales. Further questions on how the \$13 million project is to be financed were met with a smile and a "no comment."

He also declined to answer questions on who would operate the motel-hotel. But Pasetta pointed out several of the nation's top hotel chains have expressed an interest in operating the project. It would be unfair to name names until negotiations are complete, he commented.

Preceding the conference a luncheon was served which featured food of 20 different nations.

The press and visiting officials arrived in Santa Cruz via chartered bus and were taken to the Lighthouse Point site where they witnessed a surf board competition.

Dr. Hayakawa was visibly impressed by the presentation. "It takes my breath away," he commented following the show. The famed San Francisco State professor said he was in complete accord with Pasetta's belief that the venture would improve international relations.
