

# Enzweiler dies at 62

SANTA CRUZ — Bob Enzweiler, one of Santa Cruz County's best-known high school coaches for the past four decades, died Monday morning of complications after a battle with cancer.



The 62-year-old Aptos resident taught at Harbor High from the time the school opened in the fall of 1968 through 1991, when he retired.

He coached boys basketball until 1983 and continued to coach track the past five years. He was also athletic director at Harbor from 1983 to 1991 and planned to return to coach track next spring.

"This is a great loss for our entire community," Harbor High principal Ken Thomas said. "Bob had a lot of respect for the scholar-athlete and so much enthusiasm."

Enzweiler continued to coach track last spring, even after being diagnosed with brain cancer. He underwent treatment for the cancer, but recently came down with pneumonia and was unable to recover.

Thomas said Harbor High is going to name its football/track complex Bob Enzweiler Stadium, with the official dedication at the Pirates' Oct. 12 football game.

Born July 16, 1934, in Oceanside, Enzweiler graduated from Whittier College, where he was on a basketball scholarship and played guard on two conference championship teams.

He is survived by his wife, Janice Enzweiler of Aptos; two sons, Sandy Enzweiler of Aptos, and Dirk Enzweiler of Riverside; a daughter, Heidi Wilson of Framingham, Mass.; and four grandsons.

No services are scheduled. The family prefers donations be made to the Harbor High Athletic Department, or the Mar Vista Elementary School Club.
