Tide Of Dead Birds At Beach

Thousands of dead birds have I beach yesterday and today. A beach official said the tide of dead sooty shearwaters was slowing or stopped late this morning, after one truckload was swept up last night and another load this morning.

B52 Bombers Smash Area **Used By Cong**

Saigon, Viet Nam (A) Guam-based B52 jet bombers of the U.S. Strategic Air Command struck today at a suspected Viet Cong installation 30 miles in the northeast of Saigon D-zone jungle, a U.S. military spokesman announced.

This was the 11th raid of the war by the big eight - engine craft. The spokesman said it was their third strike within the D-zone, a Communist - infested territory of about 600 square miles stretching from a point north of Saigon eastward toward the South China Sea.

Under new security regulations, no further details were released.

Four years ago, the midcounty area was deluged with shearwaters by the thousands when the birds blundered inland in a flight through fog at night. The rain of birds pelted down at 3 in the morning, leaving dead and stunned shearwaters littered from Pleasure Point to Rio del Mar.

According to a zoologist, the birds probably became confused in the fog and flew inland toward lights on shore. Many of the birds were picked up by residents next day and dumped back into the sea, where they seemed to get their bearings back and recover.

This area is "winter" nesting grounds for the shearwaters. which migrate from New Zea-
