## Curtain To Go Up On Concert

The second Cabrillo Music Festival opens tonight at the Cabrillo little theater.

The 8:30 opening concert is to include Mozart's "Serenade in C minor for 8 Wind Instruments"; Schoenberg's "Serenade for 7 Instruments and Baritone" with Edgar Jones, soloist; "Serenaden for Oboe, Viola, Cello and Soprano" with soloists Leland Lincoln, Maxine Johnson, Sally Kell and Carole Bogard; and "Serenade in D for Orchestra" by Brahms.

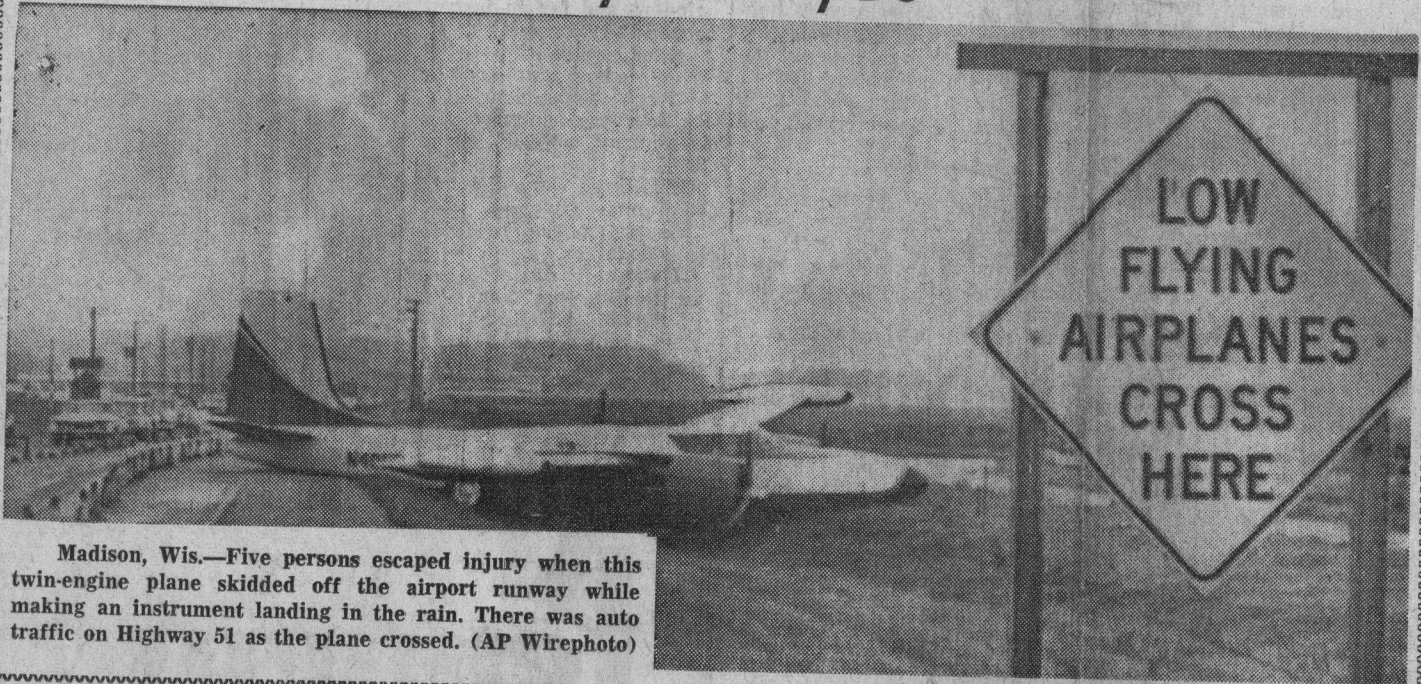
Scheduled for the concert tomorrow at 3 p.m. are Beethoven's "Archduke Trio" with soloist David Abel, Eve Heinitz and Ludwig Olshansky; "Der Kramerspiegel" by Strauss with soloists Walter Carriger and Dwight Peltzer; and Schubert's "Trout Quintet", with soloists Stanley Plummer, Maxine Johnson, Sally Kell, Mary Bresler and Janet Goodman.

The concert for tomorrow at 8:30 p.m. will include "Clarinet Quintet" by Brahms with soloists Donald O'Brien, David Abel, Judith Poska, Arthur Bauch and Ellen Desler; Frederic Myrow's "Chamber Symphony", and "Symphony Concertante" by Mozart, with soloists Stanley Plummer and Maxine Johnson.

Conductor Gerhard Samuel has chosen the music from a wide range of classic and contemporary composers with the intention of presenting works which are generally not performed in standard concerts.

# New Fighting On Cyprus

Nicosia, Cyprus (P) — Renewed fighting between Greek and Turkish Cypriots, and a government charge that Turkish planes flew over Cyprus, threatened today to

shatter the shaky truce on this Mediterranean island.

No casualties were reported in the fighting Thursday near Ktima in southwest Cyprus. Shooting between the communal factions

lasted about an hour, a U.N. spokesman said.

Turkish reconnaissance flights were reported in the Kokkina-Mansoura area where two weeks ago Greek Cypriot advances on Turkish positions triggered retaliatory air strikes by Turkey.

A U.N.-sponsored cease-fire has been in effect since the Turkish assaults.

Turkey had agreed to suspend its reconnaissance missions but warned that new attacks by Greek Cypriots would lead to further

would be the first in 10 days.

The sudden visit here of Greek Defense Minister Petros Garoufalias roused speculation. He said Thursday night after arriving from Athens that he would speak with President Makarios and inspect Greece's 950-man army contingent, based on the island under the 1960 treaty which granted independence to Cyprus.

There were rumors, however, that Garoufalias had come to persuade Makarios to reject an offer
