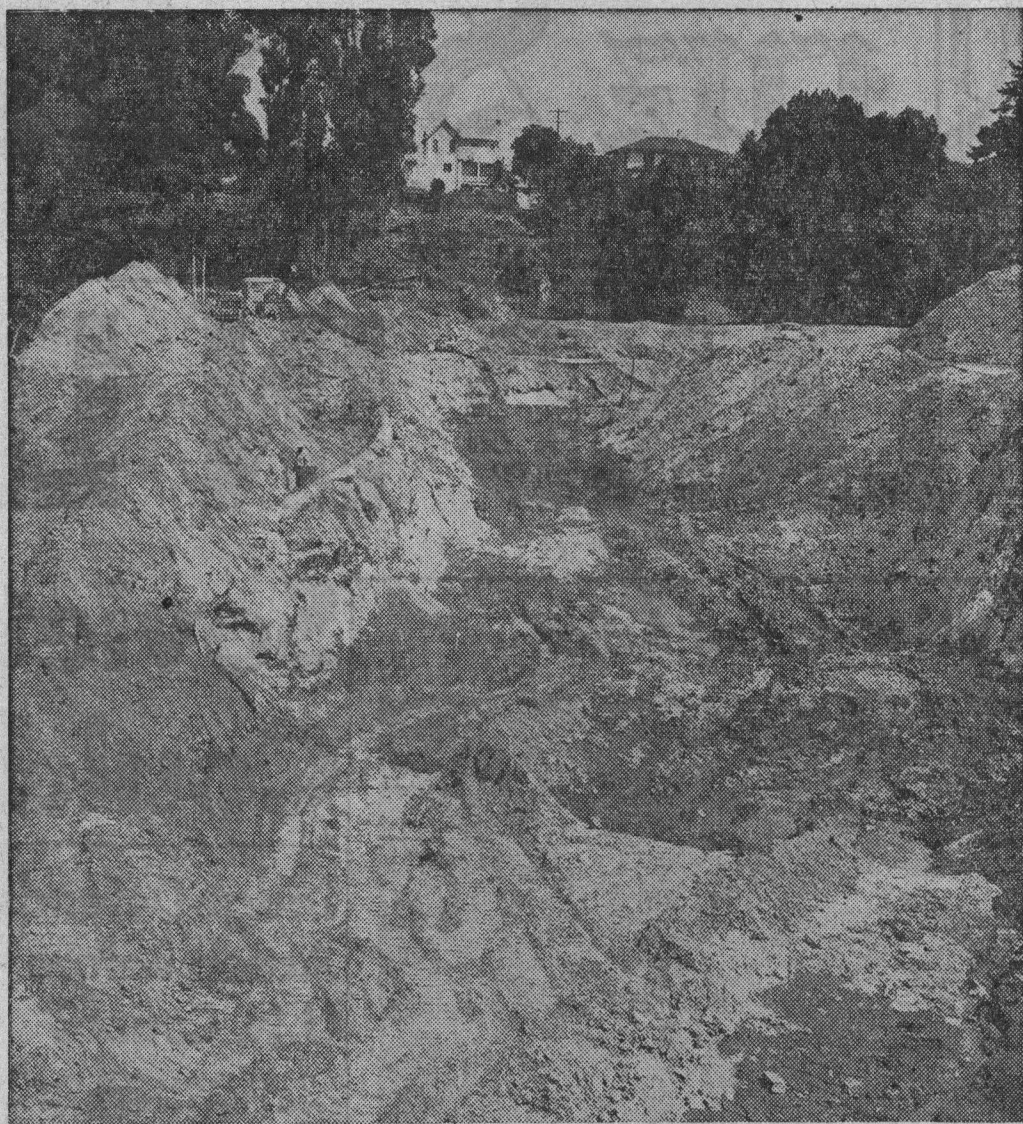
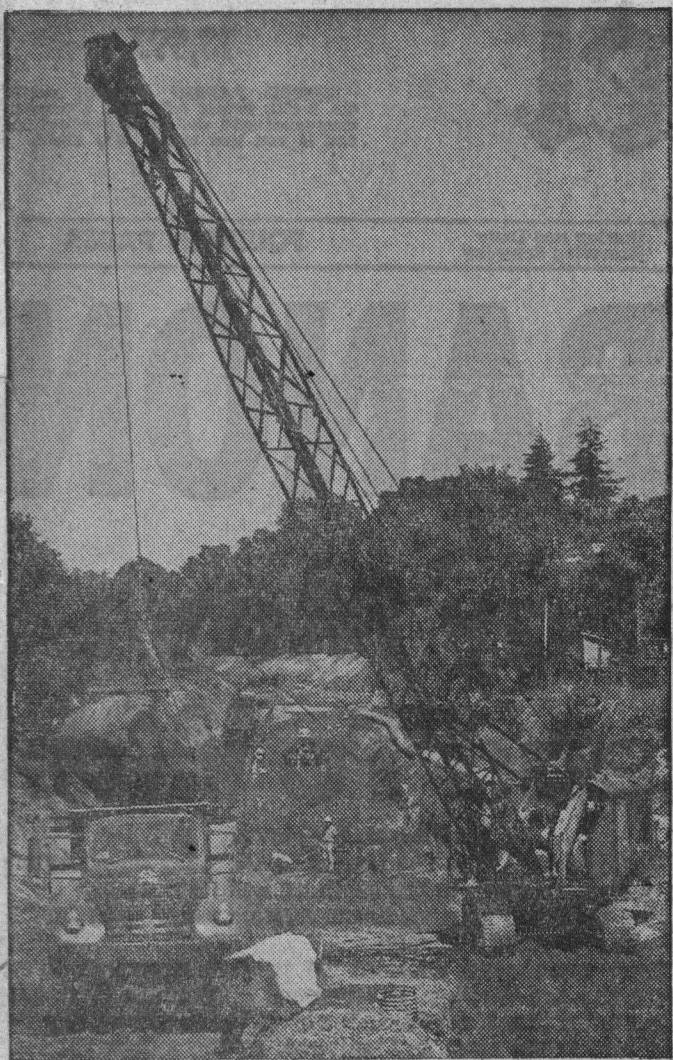

Branciforte Creek Gets Scraped And Reshaped For Flood Control



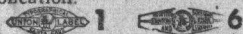

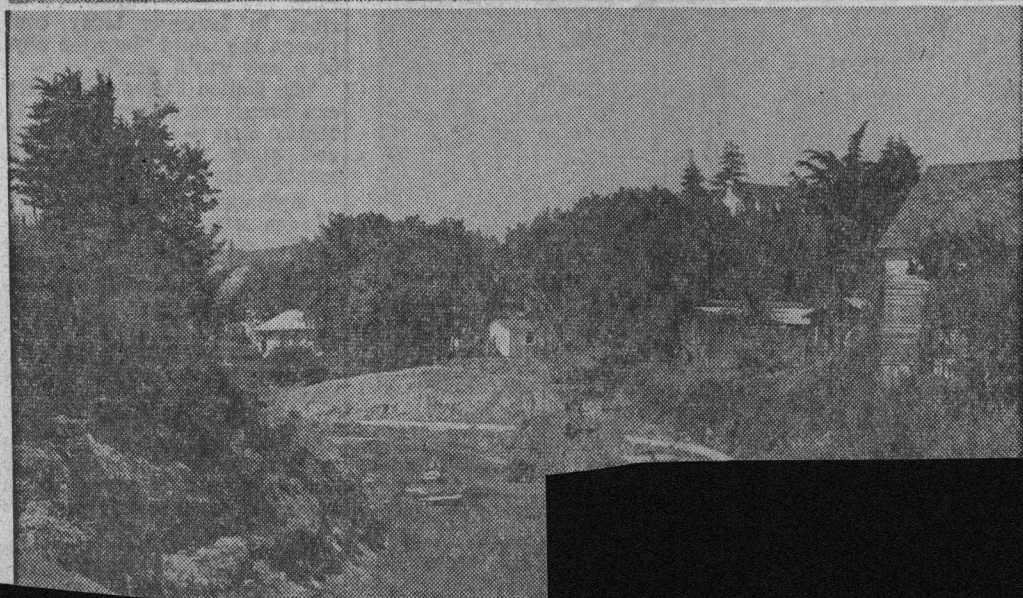

In a series of three photos, flood control work along Branciforte creek is shown in its more muddy stages. When finished the refurbished creek will be sheathed in concrete for about 1 1/4 miles up stream of the creek's mouth. According to army corps of engineer figures, the channel will be 35 feet wide with sidewalls varying from 12 to 20 feet high. Where's the creek right now? It flows through the pipe strung along the side of the excavation and shown in all three photos. The top left photo is a view north from the Water street bridge, the picture below is looking south from the same spot and the above picture shows a crane working behind the Senior Citizens building on Market street.
